The reason they did this was to show their support to the Iranian-German filmmaker Mohammad Rasoulof, who had his passport confiscated during a recent visit to Iran. He has since then been prohibited from leaving the country. Mohammad Rasoulof was invited to the Stockholm International Film Festival with his film *Manuscripts don't burn*.

On November 12, Stockholm International Film Festival and a number of Swedish and international directors also gathered outside the Iranian embassy in Stockholm for a silent protest.
