## World premiere of the Feature Film Award winner Fia Sandlund's *She's Wild Again Tonight* November 12



Fia Sandlund's contemporary interpretation of Miss Julie - She's Wild Again Tonight, has world premiere at Stockholm International Film Festival. The film is produced with support of Feature Film Award.

Two young artists meet in New York to work on a radical version of the Swedish classic Miss Julie. Instead of a professional meeting between the politically conscious artists, they become involved in a twisted game of power relations.

Starring the Swedish actor Shima Niavarani as Julie and Mando Diao's former lead singer Gustaf Norén as Jean, *She's Wild Tonight* is, in the director's words "an operation on Strindberg." The story blends the borders of reality, acting and fiction in a reflection on the complexity of contemporary society and gender roles.

She's Wild Again Tonight is the final part of the director's trilogy inspired by Strindberg's play Miss Julie, preceded by She's Blonde Like Me and She's Staging It. The script is written by Sandlund in collaboration with Josefine Adolfsson, winner of the Guldbagge Award in 2012, and produced by Tobias Janson.

Stockholm Film Festival's Feature Film Award aims to encourage emerging talented Swedish filmmakers and highlight female directors. Stockholm Film Festival launched the award with Telia as main financier and with production support from the Swedish Film Institute, SVT (Swedish National Television), Europa Sound & Vision and Dagsljus. She's Wild Again Tonight is the third film produced with support by the Stockholm Film Festival's Feature Film Award. The award has previously been granted to Sofia Norlin's Broken Hill Blues and Amanda Adolfsson's Young Sophie Bell.
